## Grants Help Fund Trail Projects

Most people are aware that Bondurant has been on an aggressive trail and sidewalk building program in the last five years. The City has received many favorable comments about these projects. The City expects to complete paving of approximately two miles of trail between 2nd St NE and 88th St., the site of the existing Chichaqua Valley Trailhead, by mid-summer, 2014. The Polk County Conservation Board expects to complete trail paving west of Bondurant to Berwick and the Gay Lea Wilson Trail by the end of 2014. This article provides a brief summary of project costs and funding sources.



The City expects to spend approximately \$2.4 million by the time all Chichaqua Valley Trail and Bondurant Regional Trailhead work is completed. The City has received \$666,752 in outside funding to date. Another \$576,200 has been pledged and should be received in the next 12 to 18 months. With interest earnings on deposits included, the City expects to receive \$1,250,066 in outside funding for trail and trailhead expenses. Approximately 50% of the costs for trail and trailhead projects will be funded by sources other than the City's debt service tax levy.

The Bondurant Regional Trailhead construction cost is estimated to be \$382,578 upon completion this year. A State Resource Enhance And Protection (REAP) grant of \$75,000 paid trailhead trail paving and decorative concrete paving costs in 2012. City funds are paying for the remaining estimated cost of \$307,578. The Depot building will cost about \$195,000 upon completion. Landscaping, Depot site paving, site furniture, site lighting and Railroad St. parking paving make up the rest of the cost. The Trailhead site plan calls for installation of a decorative wall and entry features at Main St. and Grant St. Costs for these have not been determined. A decision on whether or when to install these has not been made and will not be for at least another year. If the entry features or decorative wall are pursued, grant funds will be sought for these costs.

## Bondurant Solid Waste Collection

### New Solid Waste Carts to Be Delivered in July!

New solid waste carts will be delivered to Bondurant residents on **July 10, 2013**. The new carts are tan with black lids, and have the Metro Waste Authority logo stamped on the side. They are being provided to residents free of charge. Each resident will be provided a 96-gallon cart unless you preordered the smaller 48-gallon cart. If you would prefer a smaller, 48-gallon cart, please call 244-0021 to place an order. You do not need to call if you are satisfied with the larger, 96-gallon cart.

When you receive your new cart, please roll your **new** cart back to your house the day you receive it. Do not transfer your garbage from your old cart to your new cart. You can start using your new cart **AFTER** the July 10 collection day.

**Residents should set out their old cart (with your garbage in it) on July 10, and should LEAVE THE OLD CART AT THE CURB after it is emptied.** Crews will be around that day to collect the old carts. The order and timing in which the new carts are delivered and old carts are emptied and taken away will not necessarily be the same.

### How much will I pay?

Solid waste collection fees will increase on July 1 to keep pace with the increase in collection and disposal costs.

Anticipated garbage rates starting July 1 are as follows:

96-gallon - \$8.39 • 48-gallon - \$7.72

Senior garbage - 48-gallon - \$7.59

### New Large and Extra Item Stickers

Current large item pick-up stickers and extra trash tags will be expiring on June 30, 2013. If you have these old stickers, please use them before they expire. Effective July 1, **ORANGE** Metro Waste Authority tags must be used. These new tags will be sold at City Hall and local grocery stores for the same low price of \$5.00 or \$1.00, respectively.



When you call, they notify companies with underground utilities in the area. ## Blowing Grass Clippings onto Streets Is Prohibited

Residents are requested not to blow grass clippings into the street. Clippings can clog storm sewer intakes and also add debris to the waterways flowing through the city. Fines up to \$750 can be imposed on people found responsible for blowing grass clippings into the street. The City of Bondurant can also be cited by the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (DNR), if the DNR determines that the City is not taking appropriate action to prevent debris, such as grass clippings, from running into City storm sewers. Your cooperation in keeping our streets and waterways clean is appreciated and good for the environment.



### Stormwater Utility Rate Increase for Bondurant Residents

Commencing on July 1, 2013 and continuing thereafter, the monthly unit rate for stormwater will increase from \$3.00 to \$3.25.

# 2013 Swim Bus


**June 3 — August 5 • Mondays & Thursdays • (Weather Permitting)**

DART (Des Moines Area Regional Transit Authority) provides bus service from Bondurant to the Altoona Aquatic Center. There is no fee to ride the bus; however, pool admission is \$6.75 per day or \$70 for a 12 day card. Season passes are available for \$115/individual or \$150/2-person non-resident. Daycare or similar programs may be eligible for discounted group rates.

The bus picks up children at stops and drops them off in the same locations later in the day. Pick up route is listed below (subject to change per DART), and if the bus is full mid-route the driver will proceed to the Aquatic Center, then return to Bondurant and resume pick-ups.

**Children under 10 years old must be accompanied by someone at least 14 years of age who will be responsible for them during their trip and pool activity.** If your child takes the bus to the pool, he or she is not obligated to ride the bus back to Bondurant. The City is not responsible for children getting onto the bus, for monitoring children at bus stops, or for their activity at the pool. It is the child's responsibility to get on the bus before its departure from the pool. If a child misses the bus, their parent or guardian is responsible for picking them up at the pool.

The bus will leave the Aquatic Center at 4:00 p.m. Drop off order is the reverse of the pick up order (from I to A). The bus will not stop at any drop off locations that do not have any pick ups present. The swim bus will **not** run on days it is raining. ## Criminal or Childish Act?

Is your child considered one of the criminals in Bondurant? Are you aware of what your child is doing during the day, or even at night? Could your child be committing crimes? Facts are facts and vandalism is a crime. Most parents seem to ignore the fact that vandalism is indeed a criminal act, and rather just a prank. Vandalism is destruction of someone else's property, and it cannot and will not be tolerated. These acts show complete disrespect, and cause emotional and physical violation to the victims. Your child's involvement with vandalism may be a sign of their interest in more dangerous activities.

There are numerous reasons why vandalism occurs. Could your child be bored, or headed down the criminal lifestyle path? As a parent, explain to your child that vandalism is a crime and if caught, law enforcement officials will take action. Individuals could be forced to serve out a judge's sentence, which could be serving time or paying a fine ranging from \$1,000 to \$10,000.

Many of you may remember throwing an egg at a car or smashing a pumpkin when you were in your teens; though it may seem like a harmless prank, think of how you would feel if you were the victim in that situation today. Doesn't seem so harmless when you are the instigator, and are not on the receiving end of the vandalism. Most teens are self-absorbed, and vandalism is usually the result. Take time to have a conversation with your child about vandalism, which can in turn deter your child from going down a dangerous road.

Bondurant has recently encountered vandalism in two of our parks. We have had reports at Lake Petocka and at City Park. We have photos of children at the parks during the time of vandalism as it is under surveillance, and stated that it is under surveillance. The City is currently pursuing this criminal act and is working with the Polk County Sheriff's Department. If you are a witness to vandalism (i.e. throwing rocks, chalking, graffiti, destruction of property, etc.), contact Polk County Sheriff's Department (286-3333) and City Hall (967-2418) immediately.

## Dogs to remain on leash according to Bondurant Municipal Code Chapter 55

**55.06 AT LARGE PROHIBITED.** It is unlawful for any owner to allow an animal to run at large within the corporate limits of the City.

**55.07 DAMAGE OR INTERFERENCE.** It is unlawful for the owner of an animal to allow or permit such animal to pass upon the premises of another thereby causing damage to, or interference with, the premises.

**55.08 ANNOYANCE OR DISTURBANCE.** It is unlawful for the owner of a dog to allow or permit such dog to cause serious annoyance or disturbance to any person or persons by frequent and habitual howling, yelping, barking, or otherwise; or, by running after or chasing persons, bicycles, automobiles or other vehicles.

**55.09 BARKING DOGS.** All complaints concerning barking dogs shall be referred to the Polk County Animal Control (PCAC). The PCAC shall make a written report of each complaint and shall notify the owner of the dog of the registration of the complaint. Any dog having three (3) complaints lodged against it within seven (7) days may be ordered permanently removed from the City by the PCAC following hearing after appropriate notice and opportunity to be heard is given to the dog's owner.

**55.10 VICIOUS DOGS.** It is unlawful for any person to harbor or keep a vicious dog within the City. A dog is deemed to be vicious when it has attacked or bitten any person without provocation, or when propensity to attack or bite persons exists and is known or ought reasonably to be known to the owner.

**55.11 LEASHING.** All person owning dogs shall confine the same from running at large. It is the duty of every person owning a dog to:

1. *Confinement Required.* Confine said dog by good and sufficient means.
2. *Control.* Cause said dog to be under the control of a person competent to restrain and control the dog, either by leash, cord, chain or other similar restraint of sufficient strength, and not more than six (6) feet in length.
3. *Restraint.* Properly restrain in a motor vehicle, or house said dog in a veterinary hospital or registered kennel;
4. *Obedience.* Maintain control by obedience beside or "at heel," unless the above conditions are also met.

## Bicycle Safety - Not just for kids!!!

### Things to remember when you ride:

- **Wear a properly fitted bicycle helmet!** Protect your brain, save your life.
- **A bicycle is a vehicle.** Follow the rules of the road. When you ride in the street or bike trail, obey all traffic signs, signals, and lane markings.
- **Be visible.** Whether daytime, dawn, dusk, foul weather, or at night, you need to be seen by others. Wearing white has not been shown to make you more visible. Rather, always wear neon, fluorescent, or other bright colors when riding day or night. Also wear something that reflects light, such as reflective tape or markings, or flashing lights.
- **Be predictable.** Make eye contact. Ride on the correct side of the road, not against traffic. Look behind you before you make a turn or lane change, that lets drivers know you're up to something. Use hand signals and don't wobble around parked cars.
- **Adjust Your Bicycle to Fit.** Check Your Equipment. Before riding, inflate tires properly and check that your brakes work.
- **Watch for and Avoid Road Hazards.** Be on the lookout for hazards such as potholes, broken glass, gravel, puddles, leaves, and dogs. All these hazards can cause a crash. If you are riding with friends and you are in the lead, yell out and point to the hazard to alert the riders behind you.

##### What is Freegal Music?

- Patrons of the Bondurant Community Library are now able to download three Sony Music tracks in the MP3 format each week at no cost. The downloads are all in the MP3 format with no DRM. This service will work with any MP3 player, including the iPod, and can be loaded into iTunes. It works on both PCs and Macs.
- There are thousands of artists, tens of thousands of albums, and hundreds of thousands of songs. The Freegal site has over 100 genres of music and is rich in many of them. The content is based upon a license with Sony Music Entertainment, owner of 54 different music labels. And, new music is added daily!
- Login at with your library card number via our webpage
- At the login page, just enter your BCL library card number and your PIN. Then, click on the freegal music icon below the search and login page. Beginning your musical journey is that simple!



##### Download Limit

- Current limits are set at three downloads per week. You will be able to keep track of your downloads in the upper right corner of the site. Every song has a sample clip that you can listen to before you download.
- Your counter will set back to zero each week, Monday morning. Then, you can download three more tunes during the new week.

##### Click and Save

- When you're ready to download a track, click the "Download Now" link, select "Save" at the prompt, and designate where you want to save the song. Anytime you click on the "Download Now" link, even if you cancel the

download, the download counts toward your weekly allotment.

##### Searching

- Use the Smart Search box for suggestions when you know the name of the album, artist, or song. As you type into the search box, a list of possible artist names, track names, or album names drop down from the search tool. Click on one of the suggestions to access tracks from just that artist. If you type in a word and hit enter without selecting a suggestion, the search results will include anything that has that word in the track, name, or album.
- Use the Advanced Search to search by composer, or genre, as well as by artist, song, or album.
- Trouble Finding Your Band in the Artist Search Box?
- Find bands that begin with "The" in their name, alphabetized under the letter "T."

##### Recent Downloads

- Once in a while, your Internet connection may be interrupted or time out and you might experience an incomplete or problem download. Freegal Music allows you to download previously downloaded songs again, without using up one of your weekly downloads.
